Welcome from Maree Rudd, Chief of Championships

We are once again returning to Meribel for the British Land Senior and Junior Championships and we are very much looking forward to building on the success the new format introduced last year. Once again we are proud to work alongside our major sponsors - British Land - and look forward to the support and presence of Sir John at this year's event. The ESF provide us with the manpower to ensure that the races are professionally run and we anticipate their unwavering support and friendship as in previous years.

The aim of the change in format in 2008 was to allow both our Senior and Junior competitors the opportunity to participate in a full race programme. For 2009, there will still be the potential to compete in: 2 x Slalom, 2 x Giant Slalom, 2 x Super G, 2 x Downhill and a Super Combined. However, as many of the athletes found the intense nature of the week exhausting we have built in a rest day for men and women and a late start on the day of the night slalom for all. Obviously this is still dependant upon the weather and the success of the programme, but we hope to be able to provide a full and varied series of events.

The Super Combined is a new FIS format which we have decided to follow and consists of either 1 Downhill or 1 Super G and a single run slalom. This year we aim to use one of the Downhill events as the first leg of the Super Combined followed by a single run Slalom.

The National Junior Championship events will remain a priority and focus for our Junior competitors, and as such, any Senior athlete entering and being accepted into the competition, will not be eligible for any prizes, but will benefit from FIS points. Indeed we have decided to award prizes only to Junior competitors, in a similar format to the way our NJC Downhill is currently run.

I look forward to meeting you all again in Meribel.

It is hoped, however, that the full programme will be possible.

KIRSTEEN MCGIBBON AWARD

Since the tragic death of Kirsteen McGibbon in January 1996 a fund has been set up in her memory, thanks mostly to generous donations from all sides of British skiing. During the British Junior Championships the trustees of the fund will choose a talented, female athlete who they feel is the most deserving of a training grant. This is an annual award dedicated to the memory of Kirsteen.

JOSHUA VARLEY SCHOLARSHIP

The Joshua Varley Scholarship is a scholarship to commemorate the life of Joshua, a keen skier, who tragically lost his life in a car crash at the young age of 17 years. The £1,000 scholarship will be awarded to the best overall English Junior at the Championships.

The British Disabled Ski Team will be in attendance at the British Land National Ski Championships and will run their competitive programme in conjunction with the dates above. Full details of the programme will be confirmed shortly.

RACE INFORMATION

Licensing, Registration and Seeding

The British Land National Ski Championships is open to competitors born 1993 or earlier. All British participants must be correctly registered with BASS through their Home Nation and hold an active FIS license. All competitors must have signed the FIS Athlete Declaration form (which is part of registering for a FIS licence). Seeding for The British Land National Ski Championships will be based on FIS points.

Eligibility

A minimum BASS point criteria of 350 points has been imposed. Competitors must have reached this level in at least one discipline. British competitors normally operating outside the BASS system must demonstrate that they have reached an equivalent standard in recent competition. Applications should be submitted to SnowsportGB by the advertised deadline with the relevant supporting evidence. Applications will then be considered by the race committee and the decision published in the acceptance bulletin.

British Entries

British entries should be made in accordance with the information below and on the entry form provided. British entries must be received no later than **Friday 13th March 2009** otherwise a double entry fee will be applicable, and entry is not guaranteed.

Entries should be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee which can be paid by cheque or credit card. All cheques should be made payable to Snowsport GB and sent with the entry forms to Snowsport GB, EICA, South Platt Hill, Newbridge, Edinburgh, EH28 8AA. Entries made by credit/debit card will be subject to a 2.75% card transaction charge.

International Participation

Non-British entries to the FIS events must be made by the appropriate National Association on the FIS entry form and according to rule 215 - International Ski Competition Rules - and in accordance with rule 9.7 - International Participation in National Championships, Rules of FIS Points 2008 - 2009.

Acceptance

The Organising Committee will assess all entries and accept those from racers deemed to be of an appropriate standard. In the event of non-acceptance for any reason, the competitor has the right to appeal in writing to the Organising Committee, prior to the start of the competition. Should more than the maximum number of entries considered appropriate be received, racers will be accepted in seed point order. Every effort will be made to contact those who have not been accepted, however Snowsport GB and the organising committee accept no responsibility in the event that contact cannot be made for any reason. A British provisional acceptance list (subject to FIS regulations at the event) will be posted on Snowsport GB website (www.snowsportgb.com) by Friday 20th March 2009.

It may be necessary to limit the amount of Senior competitors in the NJC events.

Late Entries

Late entries after Friday 13th March 2009 within the qualifying standards will be accepted only in very exceptional circumstances and upon payment of double the entry fee. No guarantees can be made regarding the chances of a late acceptance and any hopeful competitor traveling to the resort before acceptance does so at his/her own risk of incurring any expense should he/she not be accepted for the Championships.

Entry Fees

Competitors must be aware that Snowsport GB incurs substantial financial liabilities in organising these events and entry fees are unlikely to be returned if the event is cancelled. The jury will consider possible refunds, or part refunds, if a competitor is ill/injured before the first team captain's meeting of the competition. No refunds will be made in resort. Such requests must be accompanied by a relevant medical certificate.

Downhill

Entries from racers who do not have Downhill points will be assessed on the basis of the Super G and GS points list. The jury has the right to prevent any competitor taking part if in training their skiing is not of an appropriate standard.

Helmets

It is mandatory for all competitors and forerunners in all disciplines to wear a crash helmet that conforms to the competition equipment specification. Helmets used in FIS Snowsports shall be specifically designed and manufactured for the particular discipline and shall bear a CE mark and conform to recognised and appropriate standards. Anti-doping Regulations

All competitors must comply with FIS anti-doping regulations. Competitors using asthma inhalers should pay special attention to new rules and regulations which came into effect from the 1st January 2009. Information is available at www.snowsportgb.com/policies.
