## Race Information

Entries are invited from competitors in one of the lowland nations (GBR, BEL, NED, and LUX) for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Indoor Lowland Championships to be held at SnowWorld Landgraaf in the Netherlands.

This event is organized by the Lowland Nations with the aim of helping the Lowland Nations to develop new partnerships. The event will count for British BASS, Belgian, Luxembourg or Dutch Snow Points as appropriate and subject to the normal criteria.

All times are provisional, we will start resetting and inspection 2nd run immediately after the end of the 1st run.

Costs: Slope entry is included in the 'SnowWorld package deal'

If you need slope entry separately the cost will be 25,- euro per day per person available at the SnowWorld ticket office.

### Entry Criteria/Invitation:

Each race is open to racers registered with their respective home nation meeting the age group categories (U10, U12, U14, U16, U18, U21, SEN and MAS. Each Nation has a specific quota; GBR, NED and BEL will have a quota of 100 and LUX will have a quota of 30. Each nation will determine their own entry criteria.

### Race entry information:

Entry procedures including entry fees, closing dates etc. will be published separately by each Nation.

Entries should be made directly to the individual Nation, for GBR this will be Snowsport England.

For GBR entries the entry fee is £30 per race day, preferred entry method via the on line entry system see [www.britisiki.org](http://www.britisiki.org) before Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September.

Each individual nation will collate and to send their race entries, including reserves if any, to Andrea Grant ([andrea@buttermountain.com](mailto:andrea@buttermountain.com) Mob: +447956422839 Tel: +441442 865477) by no later than Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September in the format that will be provided.

If a nation has remaining quota after the 12<sup>th</sup> September; the remaining quota will go to the nations that have a full quota. These remaining quota's entries must be made before September 16<sup>th</sup> September.

#### **Race information:**

The individual races will be slalom format. The U10 and U12 will race with stubbies and the remaining age groups with 27 mm poles.

The International team slalom will consist of 2 teams from each nation consisting of two males and two females, **at least one athlete in each team must come from the age groups below FIS level.**

#### **Prize Giving**

Saturday: There will be a price giving ceremony after each event on Saturday.

Sunday : There will be a price giving ceremony after the Indoor Lowlands Championship, including the Nations Cup

Nations Cup: the nation that receives the most points during the event wins the Nations Cup.

The top 5 of the categories U10,U12,U14,U16,U18,U21 and 21+ on Saturday and Sunday will receive points for the nation's cup.

The nation that collects the most points during these 2 race days and/or team event receives the nation's cup.

Individual slalom points per category:

1st 15 points - 2nd 9 points - 3rd 5 points - 4th 3 points - 5th 1 point

International Team Parallel:

1st team 60 points - 2nd team 40 points - 3rd team 30 points

#### **Rules:**

The Race will be run in accordance with FIS rules. For issues not covered by the FIS the Jury will decide. During inspection racers must wear or carry their bib so that it is visible to show that they are entitled to be in the course area. Coaches and other personnel wishing to access the slope will be required to complete a race accreditation form and be issued with an accreditation.

Inspection on foot by racers is not permissible

Helmets approved for ski racing must not be modified in any way or have camera or other adhesive mounts and must be worn by racers at all times whilst on the slope.

The U10 / U12 course will be run using stubbies.

#### **Accommodation**

We have pre-booked all the accommodation at SnowWorld. The SnowWorld online booking system will show all rooms as booked. To access the accommodation is necessary to contact SkiWorld [skiteams@snowworld.com](mailto:skiteams@snowworld.com) directly and quote LOW16.

In the accommodation becomes fully booked we will aim to identify other options with SnowWorld.
