DMA agreed to action. Two venue trial – see attached report (Enc 9) Following a 2 year trial it was agreed to revert to the original rules and adopt recommendation 12.1 of DMA report Timing Report - The Chairman reminded the meeting of the reason the May meeting thought the forum needed to create the form for use at BASS races. Form can be used to ensure Chiefs of Timing are using the correct timing equipment. JA advised that all the information required for training time keepers is included in the FIS timing manual. PHe suggested that the list of approved equipment might get withdrawn as it seemed to be drawn up in favour of the timing equipment manufacturers. The Chairman proposed trialling the new form for the 10/11 snow season and to give the Chief of Timing the option to complete the FIS form if they preferred. The new form will be added to the GBSki web site and all member groups will be notified of the FIS rules on timing equipment and the implications of not complying. Representatives of member groups who are organising FIS races in 10/11 will need to ensure the contract with the resort covers the type of timing equipment used JA agreed to review all timing reports at the end of the season. These might not all be available on the FIS site, so also check with BSS.

**Single Gate GS** – FIS have introduced the option for GS races to be run as single pole events. Concerns were expressed over safety, no defined outside gate to set course width.

Chairman – suggested that we should follow the FIS rules and avoid a repeat of the single gate slalom situation that happened in the 09/10 season.

MI propose postpone introduction for 12 months.

SB and DMe – proposed we follow the FIS decision as the option to run a single gate GS was discretionary. SB confirmed rules also apply to children's races

Chairman stressed that safety concerns should be paramount should the decision be taken to run a single gate GS. Particular points to note were; location of officials and spare poles on piste, movement on the piste during the race.

It was agreed that the BCR should follow the FIS rules on single gate GS and on the reduction of number of competitors on the second run.

**Children's Issues** – report by JS

No new equipment rules for 10/11 season

Youth Olympic Games

- 1005 maximum competitors over all FIS disciplines
- 95 year of birth will be the oldest eligible Alpine athletes
- There is no automatic GB quota, but we are likely to be allowed maximum one male and one female competitor - results at World Youth Champs may entitle us to greater quota (max 2 of each gender for the top Alpine nations).
- FIS Age Range Changes

The age of entry to FIS competitions has been increased by 1 year - to take effect from 1st July 2012. The Y&C Committee has recommended that the Children's category should remain at 4 years, with entry from minis 1 year older, and 5 years in the Junior category (GBR had preferred 4 years Junior). These recommendations are not confirmed; final decisions will be made at the FIS Spring meetings in Portoroz (May 2011).

Decisions must be made re what is done in GBR (some nations have already agreed to have 5 years in the children's category); the children's category may run in two unequal categories. The TD Forum will then consider adjustments to the BCR, as these

<p>rules may then differ from the ICR. In the transitional year, rule 607.3 re maximum number of starts in technical disciplines is likely to be temporarily suspended for one year from 1st July 2012. (Enc 12) For 2 run events held under <b>BASS</b> in an indoor venue, a category adder of 40 points was proposed by PH and accepted See also Item 6 concerning the reversion to the 2 venue criterion for seeding within BARTS. In addition, it was decided to remove the exception to allow SSE Club National events at indoor halls to be seeded as two separate single-run races. These events would in future be run as standard two-run races with a minimum penalty of 5.</p> <p><b>11.2</b> Children's Age Groups - No further comments</p> <p><b>11.3</b> BSA had proposed running a BASS seeded summer race for children on the glacier at Les Deux Alpes. Concerns were expressed over the shifting nature of a glacier surface and the consequent risks. Moreover, there is neither the expertise nor experience amongst British TDs to undertake the formal homologation of an alpine slope for children's racing.
